

CITY OF FOREST HILLS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
JULY 11, 2022

Mayor Kenny Griffin opened the regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. Meeting was held in the Community of Christ Church.

City Commissioner Members: Kenneth Griffin (Mayor), Sharon Doll (Public Works), Sharon Henry (Finance/Landscaping), Gayle Knoop (Safety), and Robbie Taylor (Sanitation).

City Employees: Sgt. Tulio Tourinho (police officer), Pat Cooke (Clerk/Treasurer), John Singler (Attorney) and Mark Madison (City Engineer & Code Enforcement Officer).

Others Present: Several residents

Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: All present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Com. Doll made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Com. Henry. Motion carried.

Mayor Griffin gave the floor to Robert Lemon. Mr. Lemon was upset about the speed hump sign that had been put in the middle of his front yard and wanted to know why he had not been made aware of the position of the sign. Mr. Madison explained the whole process of putting in speed humps from idea, to plans, to posting of signs, indication of speed humps and then installation. He told Mr. Lemon that posts with a notice had been put in the yards where the signs would be for a month before the signs were put up. Mr. Lemon stated he never had a sign in his yard. After some discussion, Mr. Madison agreed to meet with Mr. Lemon the next day to see if some adjustment could be made. Mr. Madison then needed to leave to attend another meeting.

One of the residents made a comment about the hanging garage door at the property that had recently been auctioned. Mr. Singler will send a letter to the owner requesting the door be closed

Reports:

Finance: Com. Henry reported that the various accounts have a total of \$427,974.95. She made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Com. Knoop. She also reported that one of the CDs at Stock Yards Bank had come due and it was decided to just let it roll over.

Sanitation: Com. Taylor had been notified that there was another change in service and Waste Management would adjust our next bill.

Public Safety: Traffic has slowed down on Narwood since installation of the speed humps. Sgt. Tourinho stated that juveniles have broken into some cars but that should slow down once school is back in session.

Public Works: Com. Doll reported a street light out again and she has contacted LG&E. LG&E had installed the wrong new light fixtures and will have them changed out. Rueff has started on the new entrance signs but some parts are still on order. MSD has filled, leveled and seeded the hole on Cherian by the Scripture Garden.


City Clerk: She will not be in the office on Thursday, July 21st so the office will be closed.
